Applying for Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

For many families, the last few years have been incredibly difficult financially due to the impact of the pandemic and the current cost of living crisis. If your circumstances have changed since your child started school, you may now be entitled to Pupil Premium or Free School Meals. If you fit any of the criteria, please get in touch with the school office and we will get you to fill in the form which then enables us to check with the Local Authority. This will be dealt with in great confidence. Please also note that for every child in school who registers their eligibility, the school receives additional funding and you will also receive trips and residential at a lower cost.

Uniform

The children have returned to school looking smart and are ready for learning. Please can I remind you that school uniform consists of: a navy jumper or cardigan, a red polo shirt, grey or black trousers/skirt/pinafore and plain black shoes. Children with hair longer than shoulder length should also be tied back. On PE days, children should come to school wearing their kit which includes: plain white t-shirt, navy shorts or jogging bottoms and trainers. Leggings should not be worn and earrings should be removed or covered if newly pierced. Thank you!

Covid-19 Guidance

Children and young people with respiratory infection who have not taken a Covid-19 test:

Most people can no longer access free testing for Covid-19.

Children and young people, who are unwell and have a high temperature, should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

Children and young people who have tested positive with a Covid-19:

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

Children and young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults. The day of the test should be counted as day zero. After three days, if they feel well enough and no longer have a high temperature, they can resume normal activities.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

Office News

Cashless School- we are now a cashless school. All payments should now be sent via ParentPay. If you have any difficulties accessing this account, please contact the school office.

Contact details- please ensure all contact details are up to date by informing the school office.

ParentMail- This is the school's main point of communication. All letters and school information are shared to parents and carers through this system. Parents are required to sign up to the Parent Mail App. If you notify school of any change to your email or telephone number, this is recorded on our pupil MIS system. ParentMail will then send a push notification asking to authorise these changes. Please authorise these changes within your account as you will not be able to receive any school communication. Please see the school office if you require any support.

Absence- If your child is absent from school, please telephone school as soon as possible on the morning of absence. Thank you.
